www.compasslearningodyssey.com

(all grades K-5th grade)

This is the main site that students use at Prairie View. Most of the lessons on this site are geared towards what the students needs help in. When the students take the Acuity test; assignments are assigned according to their scores. Students may access this site from home and may work on the assignments. Their user name and password is their cafeteria number and the name they enrolled at GCS with. An example of this is 123Debra, 123Deb would not work because it has been shortened. I would like to encourage you to sit down with your child and look at this site. Please check the System Requirements before using this site to make sure the site works properly.

(1st grade -8th grade)

This site has a variety of subjects and levels. Subjects are: Addition/Subtraction games, Multiplication/Division games, Fraction/Ratio games, Language Arts games and a State and Country Capital game. They can play with multiple players or as a single player. They can set up a Private game (we did Private games at school but they can set up Private games at home and just share it with school friends on line) or go on line and play with someone else. No information is exchanged and the only thing that shows up is their user name. On some of the games, they have the choice of what level and the speed that the game will play.
